




President's Message

2022-2024 Strategic Plan Unveiled

At its most recent meeting, the PRIA Board of Directors approved the 2022-2024 strategic plan. The plan was crafted during a strategic planning meeting prior to the 2022 Winter

Symposium and was guided by data from a comprehensive member survey.

There are four major goal areas – education, membership recruitment and engagement, data aggregation and the use of reserve funds.

For education, initiatives include expanding the LMS, promoting features of the website and revamping the conferences.

Membership engagement tactics include reactivating the state coordinator program and focusing recruitment on five states. Those states include: Arkansas, Ohio, Oklahoma, Texas, and Washington. These states currently have a state recruiter and have a low percentage of members vs. non-members.

Check Out These Recent PRIA Publications

Since the end of December, PRIA has published several papers of interest to the industry. These papers, plus many more on a variety of topics, are available in the PRIA **Resource Library**. Just type in a keyword to find resources on a given topic.

Electronic Notarization Frequently Asked Questions provides answers to questions about eNotarization and RON and provides examples of what an electronic notarization might look like.

An additional notary product was posted in January, *Interstate Recognition White Paper*. The paper defines interstate recognition, its impact on Remote Online Notarization and the recorder's role in accepting documents notarized in another state.

PRIA's paper on *Redaction Best Practices* is the most recent publication added to the Resource Library as a complement to several previously published papers on related topics: *Automated Redaction Technology*, a 50-state list of redaction legislation and an informational paper on *Social Security Numbers*.

Redaction is the most common solution for concealing private data in a property record from public view and can be generally categorized into three types: ADCON (Address Confidentiality), CRIS (Confidential Recorded Instrument Shielding) and PII (Personally Identifiable Information).

The paper defines and explains nine redaction best practices.

PRIA Website Matters – Community Forum

Have you explored PRIA's Community Forum?

Visit **pria.us/members** and click on the "Community Forum" tile or the "My membership" tile. Either option will get you to the community.

You will be prompted to insert your login credentials to gain access.

After logging in, you will see a "First Time Visitor" page, assuming this is your first time to log into the forum, and will be asked to read and agree to the Community's Code of Conduct. Be sure to read the "rules" and "etiquette," a guide to posting messages for maximum results.

Once you scroll through the Code of Conduct, check the box beside "I have read and agree to the Community's Code of Conduct" and click "Proceed."

The next page will ask you to update your profile, your interests and other settings. Please note that you can only change your display name the first time you login. Once you have changed it, the system will not allow you to make further updates. If you haven't already done so, be sure to upload a picture in the profile section. Profiles with pictures make connections more personal.

Now that your profile has been updated, you are ready to explore the forums. There is a forum for General Discussions where you can ask questions or offer comments to the PRIA membership. Leverage the PRIA community to get answers about your most pressing industry concerns. Start a "Thread" on a specific topic, like "redaction legislation," "RON," or restrictive covenants.

There is a forum for each PRIA committee so you can stay up-to-date on their activities, and offer suggestions. Each of PRIA's current work projects has a forum, some with multiple threads. ALL committee and work group forums are accessible by PRIA members.
