Choose a self-guided art walk along [Roosevelt Row](#) to see the creative, colorful work of local street artists.

Cocktails anyone? Try Bitter & Twisted, a downtown hotspot on the ground floor of the historic Luhrs Tower. The restaurant/bar menu offers 116 cocktails while the food menu is filled with street-food focused fare of small bites, shareable plates and dishes perfect for snacking.

Pizza aficionado? Downtown Phoenix has you covered. In recent years, a wave of new pizzerias has hit the scene, giving Phoenix cred to join New York and Chicago as a must-visit destination for pizza connoisseurs.

[CiBo](#) (pronounced "CHEE-boh") is located in a restored 1913 bungalow and offers beautiful salads, antipasto, artisanal pizzas and house made fresh pasta.

[Forno 301](#) The owners hail from Sanremo in northwestern Italy and serve East Coast-style, wood-fired pizza with a lot of bravado. The restaurant combines both traditional and contemporary combinations for their pizzas.

[Pomo Pizzeria](#) serves handcrafted pizza in the tradition of Old Italy. It's about as authentic as you can get beginning with slow-rising sourdough made with wheat flour from Naples, Mediterranean sea salt and water.

Looking for something more upscale? How about a chic restaurant with impeccable culinary creations and flawless service? This exceptional treatment and penchant for detail is a reality in many high-end Phoenix restaurants, which cater to customer's dining expectations.

[Lon's at The Hermosa Inn](#) is where earthy adobe meets sophisticated setup with a world-class view. Old-age methods of smoking, roasting and grilling converge with classic European cooking techniques for an exceptional modern culinary event.

[Quiessence at The Farm](#) is located in an historical house at The Farm at South Phoenix and is defined as a high-end epicurean adventure for those with a taste for market-driven, American-inspired, sustainable food and wines.

[Vincent on Camelback](#) meets the cafés of France and is one of the longest-running restaurants in the Valley. The restaurant is decidedly intimate and intriguing, serving classic French cuisine infused with Southwestern ingredients.
